Death of a former mayor of Otterburn Park Pierre Beauregard

Otterburn Park, February 5, 2025 – It is with great sadness that we announce the death of Pierre Beauregard, former mayor of Otterburn Park, on January 30 at the age of 74. A prominent figure in local politics, he dedicated many years of his life to serving citizens and developing our community.

Mr. Beauregard served as a municipal councillor from 1985 to 1989 and then as mayor of Otterburn Park from 1989 to 1993, during which time he played a key role in preserving the rural character of the municipality by adopting many urban planning by-laws and requiring real estate developers to reserve 10% of their projects for green spaces. The administration of the Ville d'Otterburn Park would like to express its deepest sympathies to Mr. Beauregard's family and friends. His commitment and legacy will continue to inspire future generations.

2025-2030 Strategic Plan for the Ville d'Otterburn Park

The Municipal Council was very proud to adopt the Ville d'Otterburn Park's 2025–2030 Strategic Plan on December 16, 2024. The adoption was officially announced on Wednesday, December 18, during a press conference.

Why strategic planning?

Strategic planning is an essential tool for our city's good management. It determines the objectives to be achieved, the guiding principles and the strategic projects that guide our future achievements.

How did we do that?

As a first step, a strategic steering committee was created to begin the process. In May 2024, we approached local companies to gather their perspectives. Subsequently, a survey was submitted to residents to gather their opinions, with the aim of preparing for a citizen consultation which was held in June 2024. It was followed by a strategic workshop to bring together elected officials, citizen members of the steering committee and departments to establish priorities.

The 2025–2030 strategic plan enabled the City to define its mission, vision and values. Adoption followed in December 2024, marking a key milestone for the City.

Mission

The Ville d'Otterburn Park's mission is to improve the quality of life in its community by promoting initiatives that enrich the community and strengthen social ties. It is based on inclusive and bold decisions, aimed at providing a harmonious living environment that fosters well-being, encourages fellowship and respects the balance between urban development and nature.

Vision

Where do we want to go for the next five years? We want to grow in line with our authentic character and support our united and engaged community. Our city will continue to stand out for its peaceful and lively living environment, inspired by nature.

Values

SNOW REMOVAL

To help us do a better job, do not park on the street during snow removal operations (with the exception of part of Dormicour Boulevard).

Do you need to clear snow from your driveway? Be careful, you must not push snow into the street.

Do you live on a street corner?

For safety and visibility reasons, you may not pile snow more than one metre high within the visibility triangle of a street corner.



Do you live in a roundabout? Snow may be temporarily deposited at a specific location in the roundabout until our team can come and collect it. In some cases, snow may also remain in place if it is not deemed to be a safety or traffic problem. We will ensure that the situation is properly managed as soon as possible.

Do you have a fire hydrant on your property? Above all, don't bury it under piles of snow! Make sure that access to it remains free at all times. During a fire, the first few minutes are crucial and the Fire Department must have access to the hydrants as quickly as possible.

Finally, we remind you that the City cannot salt all streets. It is therefore important to adjust your driving according to the state of the road and the weather.

URBAN PLANNING AND ENVIRONMENT

Reminder about parking on Dormicour Boulevard

Following the meeting of Monday, December 16, 2024, By-law number 460-9 was adopted.

What does it mean for area residents?

From now on, you can say goodbye to the hassle of looking for a spot under the moon in the middle of winter during the usual overnight parking ban period, from December 1 to March31, between 2 a.m. and 7 a.m. And yes, part of Dormicour Boulevard (see map) will now be accessible to overnight parking (even-numbered side only). Of course, when necessary, for the smooth running of snow removal operations, signs prohibiting parking will be installed.

But what else?

New stop signs have been installed at the intersection of Dormicour Boulevard and Louis-Lévesque Avenue. Stop signs at the four corners!

Rosalie Dessaulles, forgotten seigneuress of the Papineau line (in French)

A BIT OF HISTORY

The Bosquets Albert-Hudon wooded area

In the January 7 edition of L'Œil Régional newspaper, the Ville d'Otterburn Park announced the submission of a purchase offer to the Fondation Papillon for Des Bosquets Albert-Hudon woodlot, located on the picturesque banks of the Richelieu River.

This vast piece of land set in the heart of the urban complex has been an integral part of Otterburn Park for many years. The City hopes to acquire it in order to preserve it and make it available to the public again. But what do we know about the place and the name Albert Hudon?

This vast wooded area has always aroused great interest on the part of the seigneurs Hertel and Campbell who constantly preserved it. From 1885 to 1944, parc Otterburn (now called Des Bosquets Albert-Hudon) was initially owned by the Campbell brothers, then administered only by Bruce Campbell. For a long time, the area was considered the largest public park in Canada and, since its creation, it has attracted many day-trippers from Montreal and the surrounding area who wanted to enjoy fun days of rest and relaxation.

In 1944, the wealthy Albert Hudon acquired parc Otterburn from the estate of Bruce F. Campbell to turn it into a recreational area for the orphaned, poor and abandoned youth of Montreal. This is why he donated all the land in parc Otterburn before notary Eugène Poirier on August 14, 1946 to make it a summer camp near Montreal. It was administered by a trust formed by the Archbishop of Montreal, Sun Trust Limited and Buissonnets Inc. The trust ended on December 23, 2003 following a judgment of the Superior Court. The judge authorized the former trustees to proceed with the deed of gift in trust in favour of the Société pour les enfants handicapés du Québec.

Now, let's get to know the life of this generous donor. Albert Hudon (1872–1950) was the son of Firmin Hudon and Azélie d'Odet d'Orsonnens. His first marriage was to Anne-Marie Casgrain, the daughter of Eugène Casgrain and Philomène Pouliot, on June 4, 1901 in L'Islet. His second marriage was to Albertine Roch, daughter of Narcisse Roch of L'Épiphanie, on June 16, 1919 in Saint-Jacques, Montreal. However, he had no descendants. A merchant, philanthropist and benefactor of the École des Hautes Études Commerciales, Albert Hudon was a director of numerous industrial and financial companies, including, among others, Viau Biscuits Corporation, Sun Trust Limited, Sorrento Macaroni Ltd., Hudson Bay Insurance Co., Melchers Distilleries and Le Pain Moderne limitée. Albert Hudon was also mayor of the city of Laval-de-Montréal in 1923 (formerly a municipality, attached to the Ville de Pointe-aux-Trembles in 1925), a justice of the peace, a governor of five Montreal hospitals and a member of numerous associations.

This short retrospective shows that it is possible to combine business success with charitable causes. Albert Hudon's intention to acquire parc Otterburn to turn it into a recreational area for children with disabilities made it possible to protect the rich and diverse nature that today characterizes Les Bosquets Albert-Hudon. This is why his name should remain closely associated with the Otterburn Park community.
